Swimming Pool Emergency Rescue Award (SPERA) 2 Day Course



About the Course

The Swimming Pool Emergency Rescue Award Programme is a 2-day course for candidates to achieve a rescue award; it is designed for individuals that have a responsibility to respond to a swimming pool in the event of an emergency, either to perform a rescue or assist a lifeguard team.

The SPERA Pool Programme is not intended to be used in place of a lifeguard qualification, such as the National Pool Lifeguard Qualification (NPLQ). The NPLQ includes more detailed training and content, to prepare someone to directly supervise a swimming pool.

Pre-Requisites

- Be able to swim a minimum of 25m on your front and back
- Be able to surface dive to the deepest part of the pool and climb out without help and without using steps or ladders (where venue design permits)
- Be aged 16 or older at the beginning of the course

Recommended For

Any staff employed at a venue with a pool e.g.

- Receptionists
- Chefs
- Waiting staff
- Housekeeping
- Maintenance staff
- Duty Managers
- Gym staff
